<p>Bedford Borough Council Local Plan review consultation</p>	<p>BBC have been asked to undertake this work because the recently completed and published plan for 2030 did not take into account the development of the Oxford-Cambridge Arc. The Government expects there to have been construction of one million dwellings by 2050. There are 5 models for building developments in this consultation. The grey dispersed model could impact significantly on Riseley and all villages across the Borough with the housing construction shared proportionately. Claire highlighted the impact this could have on Riseley's road infrastructure. Bedford BC has a very low number of adopted Neighbourhood plans (2) with a larger number (29) in progress. Within the consultation there is indication that the 2 adopted plans will be adhered to but in a significant change BBC reserves the right to allocate specific sites in communities for development in all others. There is a further call for sites by BBC closing on 14th August. New sites will be added to those listed in the 2030 plan. A link to the consultation will be circulated.
